CRYSA Administrators Report October 5, 2009

Fall soccer is into its 4th week and Thanksgiving is approaching. Everything seems to be working fine; there have been some minor glitches that were ironed out.

There was a scheduling problem for one weekend in the Under 11/12 group which was corrected.

UISA scheduling has been toned down with some movement with LISA. Although the original interlock schedule has been suspended, some teams are willing to play home and away games. LISA teams were unaware of the Associations stand on interlocking.

Pinecrest Park and the City works have finally decided to fix the drainage problem we have been having for the past 3 years. They decided to do it last Tuesday without giving us notice, which did cause some confusion on how to play around it. I must commend the Under 10 group and their parents for their ability to adapt to the safety of the players.

There are still some gym times that have not been used and if any coaches want indoor practice time they should book it now. As in the past coaches should contact the school they have practices at and make sure they are aware that their team is using the gym.

Outdoor evening practices under the lights. Due to a glitch in the Parks department, staff were giving out practice times at the Homer Dome without Linda Nagle's permission, thus the week of October 5 – 9th will stay the same until the following week. At that time I will be able to start making bookings for those teams who want to use the lights on the grass and the All Weather field.

Picture schedules are now out and I am awaiting the envelopes from Ken Bell. If you have not received your date and times from your Divisional Manager, please find out when and where your pictures are being taken. If you cannot make the scheduled time and date please call Ken up and make alternate plans.

ID Picture sessions are now finished and I must say that this has been the first year that I have received all pictures that have been requested. REP team pictures will be ready shortly and you must sign for them. Please do not give the cards to the players, they are secured by the one person who signs for them and they are responsible for handing them back in at the end of the season.

In talking to Neil Ogg at Intersport, he informed me that the Santos Travelling Suit would be discontinued in 3 – 4 months and advised me of another suit that was close to the Santos and would be in circulation up to 2012. I have made the changes to the order form and have updated the website to reflect the new suit and the pricing along with pictures.

I did order a new paint machine and it has arrived. Wayne has put it together and it is in the furnace room at the clubhouse.

Currently we have 483 player registered for our Fall program, this includes all REP teams (8) and house teams (32) as well as 3 players who are just involved in Junior Development. Report to be sent to UISA for assessment fees is complete.

We held a Futsal registration this past weekend and I completely forgot that we were supposed to have one the previous weekend. Currently we have 23 players registered for the program. (14 in Group 1) and (9 in Group 2) We will need to be more proactive in this area for the program to be a success.

On a disappointing note, Kidsport will no longer be funding any sports group due to the cuts by the government. As of now they are doing fund raising to try and keep the chapter going.
