# CRYSA Administrators Report

## April 13, 2009

Spring Soccer League is on its way. There haven't been any reported problems, so I am assuming everyone is happy. We 68 teams with 800 players registered to date which is down about 160 from last year's season. Our ever popular Tot's program only has 12 teams compared to 16 from last year.

Sponsors are down this year, including McDonald's and Tim Horton's who could only sponsor at Level 2. The same goes for Home Hardware dropping from Level 4 to Level 2. We did pick up one Level 3 Sponsor from Grieg Seafood's and BMO Canada who is sponsoring the whole Under 7 age group.

Spring Schedules are now up on our website along with our picture schedule. Ken Bell will again be taking our team photographs over a 4 week period.

Both Quality Foods and Thrifty Foods have agreed to supply all the teams with oranges. The teams have been informed about which store will be supplying them with oranges and Thrifty's has 30 of the teams and Quality Foods has 38 teams.

Congratulations go out to our Under 12 girls who won the tournament hosted by Oceanside at the end of the season. Also to our U14 Girls, U18 girls and U16 Boys who have won the right to represent UISA at this years Island Finals on Salt Spring Island in May. Our U17 Boys are still waiting to play Nanaimo to see who goes. Our U13 Boys and Girls should be commended for their valiant effort, especially the Boys who lost out in a 3 -2 shootout.

I have had to purchase some newer keyed locks to lock up the goals, so that the chain doesn't go missing. I am hoping that everyone will be a little more careful in locking up the goals in the future.

I am finalizing my report to UISA in the next week so that we can pay our BCSA player assessments. As you know the CSA raised the fees by \$3 and so did BCSA by \$3. The fees for players from TOTS to Under 10 have gone from \$16 to \$22 and players from Under 11 to Under 18 have gone from \$27 to \$33.

The CR Mirror had to layoff Pieter Uni as their sports reporter and is relying on all the clubs to send in their articles no later than 9am Monday morning, as the only space they have for sports is in the Wednesday paper. So if you want game stars in the paper they have to be into me no later than 9pm Sunday evening. The Courier Islander still has Ken Zaharia at the helm and he will do his best to get our stars in.

As mentioned before we have 800 players registered to play spring soccer. We still have some opening still available from the Under 10 and down age groups. All the older age groups are pretty well full. I must emphasize that if players are not registered they cannot play. Even those who want to try it out for a weekend must fill out the paper work and pay their fees.

Some volunteers have not filled out their Risk Management forms and need to do so before participating in our program.

I will be away from my desk from May 1<sup>st</sup> to May 10<sup>th</sup>, but will be checking my emails on a daily basis.
