Technical Director

- Ken reported the following:
- **District Development Centre**

The spring DDC program will run from Monday April 10th to Monday July 10th. Session will be from 5:30 – 7:00 pm at Robron Oval. This program will be for boys and girls from U12 – U14. The first session will be an evaluation session where we will evaluate the players and select a total of 24 players and four – six goalkeepers for the spring DDC.

The cost of the program is \$100.00 and includes a full set of strip.

We will notify all players and coaches in these age groups over the next week or so with further details.

- **Coaching Clinic**

Since we were unable to get enough interest in the CCC we would like to run a coaching session for spring league coaches on April 2nd from 9:30 – 11:00 at Pinecrest Park. This clinic would focus on practice structure, teaching using small-sided games and introduction to Byte Size Coaching.

- **IPL – Intra Provincial League**

The IPL will begin on May 7th and run until July 30, 2006. The program is for boys and girls U12 8 v 8 to U14. The Upper Island is a zone for the IPL therefore our teams will be made up of players from the Upper Island.

Campbell River is well represented in the IPL:

Other coaches

These coaches will be in contact with the DDC's to announce their try-outs and select their teams.

- **Super Y League**

The Super Y League is set to run for the third year with evaluations starting last weekend in various venues around the island.

The program is for boys U13 – 17 and girls u13 – 16. Vancouver Island is a zone for the Super Y League therefore the teams will be made up of players from all over the island.

Victoria United is the name of the Super Y League team which is run by the Lower Island Soccer Association. The LISA is affiliated with Victoria United.

We have been sending information about Y League try outs but have had a very poor showing from our players in Campbell River. I think this is because coaches are not passing this information on to their players. I would like to have approval to send all IPL and Y League information to players instead of coaches to ensure they are getting the information.

- **U15 Girls Provincial Teams Program**

We are bringing the U15 Girls Provincial Team to Campbell River for a four day training camp from May 4th – 7th. We are including a training session with the team for selected girls from our DDC on either May 5th or 6th.

We will also be playing one game during our camp against Carihi Senior team on May 5h at 4:00 pm at either Carihi or Willow Point Park.

Motioned by Henry Roller, that the Club buy a cooler up to \$3000 plus taxes if the cooler Annie has doesn't work out. Seconded by Sharon. Carried.

- Darrell Knowles doesn't think that the Club should offer money for windups due to our low fees. Discussion. Motioned by Darrell that effective Fall 2006 session that the windup budget is eliminated, seconded by Henry Roller, carried. This will be removed from the Coaches Manual for Fall 2006 session.
- Sarah Mellish began a discussion on combining age groups for rep play and UISA league play. Ken Garraway suggested putting a committee together to brainstorm how we can keep our older players involved in soccer. Committee to consist of Victor Coblenz, Darrell Knowles, Ken Garraway, Lisa Fawkes, Annie Ledlin, and Graham Sibley.
- Graham brought up the issue of continuing with Spring T-shirts that the players keep or going to jerseys which are returned to the club. Discussion. Consensus was to continue with the T-shirts.
- April 3rd is the next Mini World Cup meeting. Hope to see you there.

CRYSA ADMINISTRATORS REPORT MARCH 2006

I recently visited our previous club administrator Beth Hamilton who has been battling a blood cancer. She is so strong facing such adversity and shows a fantastic attitude in her struggle towards good health. I am sure that Beth would like to hear from members of CRYSA.

We need to complete our projects at the clubhouse. This includes attaching the gutters and down pipes, repairing the new roof, painting the trim and completing the change room revisions.

We had an early Provincial entrant as the girls U12 have qualified for the semi finals of the Coastal Cup and also for the Provincials. Congratulations!

The U16 and 17 girls, plus the U13, 17 and 18 boys all made it to the zone finals and put on a great show but unfortunately only the U13 boys were successful. Hey! There's always next year!

Meantime please return all of your kit. You can arrange to leave it with Rick or with me just call.

Club Kit has gone over very well with so many of our teams. Unfortunately we haven't had the same success with the Linkman jackets and pants, but there is some cause for optimism. The product is excellent but they are a little difficult to acquire!

Spring league has started with registrations on Feb 25 and March 4 and appeared to be going very well with over 400 signed up at the end of February. There were 744 on March 6th. Coaches meetings are on Wednesday March 22 for the Tots to U7, and Thursday March 23 for the rest.

Hopefully we will have the kit ready by then.

Tag day is arranged. I am working on the picture schedules for April 9, 23 and 30.

This year has seen quite a change in our Divisional sponsorships but fortunately we have received support from several brand new sponsors and this has limited the impact on our club's finances.

The division managers are Troy Perras for Tots, Jeremy Morgan for U6, Roy Williams for U7, Charlene Friedrich for U8, Lisa Fawkes for U10, Annie Ledlin for U11/12 and Gerold Elter for the U13. We are waiting for a U9 division manager to take over from Darrell Knowles .

Teams consist of 12 teams of 12 for Tots, 8 teams of 10 for U6, 10 teams of 10 for U7, 10 teams of 11 for U8, 8 teams of 11 for U9, 6 teams of 10 for U10, possibly 10 teams of 11 for U11/12, and 6 teams of 17 for U13.

Pony World Cup is very much on the go and we have had several meetings of the volunteer group. Grieg Seafoods BC Ltd has just signed on as a sponsor. We have received donations from Quinsam Radio, Calpine, Timberwest, Rona and Catalyst, other donations are in the works.

Advertisements were placed in both the Courier and Mirror on Feb 22 and 24. They were also featured in the daily paper. This was quite costly, but it served a triple purpose. It contained spring registration information, World Cup information and a "thank you" to our many sponsors. These ads were quite effective and we have received positive feedback

Clinics were to begin with the CCC on March 11 but unfortunately the course was cancelled due to a lack of entrants. There will be a local coach's clinic which Ken is arranging.
